

Our pre-registered design was aiming to study the extent to which moral wiggle room might decrease contributions towards a public good. After analysing our collected data, we have found no significant differences between our baseline treatment and the embezzlement of contributions treatment (which incorporates a moral wiggle room manipulation). This lack of significant difference may be driven from limited understanding of the features of the game, which becomes evident after analysing the responses of the participants in the de-briefing questionnaire. In order to rule out this explanation we plan to re-implement the experiment with updated instructions and comprehension quiz to enhance the level of understanding of the participants. This will help us identify if indeed moral wiggle room does not influence contributions, conversely to what we hypothesised, or whether the lack of significant differences identified in the earlier implementation was due to limited understanding.
