#### Colorado ReHire Intake Survey Section CR: Matching Game (Raven)

Stop Rule: Stop if all the first 5 items on Ravens are incorrect after explaining examples Interviewer say: "Now we will do something a little different. We want to play a game of matching pictures. This is a game of observation." (open the book at A1)

"On each page of this book there is a pattern that is missing a piece. You need to point to the piece that correctly completes the pattern. Look at each of the 6 possible pieces carefully. When you have chosen the piece you think completes the pattern, point at the piece with your finger. If you think you made an error and want to change your answer, just tell me which one you think is correct."

Interviewer say: "First, I am going to walk through an example on this page.
