Note: The chance that the vaccine will run out of stock is higher for those who get the shot late, after December 31st, than for those who get the shot early, before December 31st.

The vaccination is free. You can get the shot in your clinic or any other clinic within the HMO.

<u>Increased Costs</u>: In addition, the Ministry of Health recommends getting the shot early, in the beginning of the season, until December 31st, in order to increase its effectiveness for you and for the rest of the population.

Note: The vaccine is free for those who get the shot early, until December 31st, but it costs 20 ILS for those who get the shot late, after December 31st.

You can get the shot in your clinic or any other clinic within the HMO.

<u>Benefit</u>: In addition, the Ministry of Health recommends getting the shot early, in the beginning of the season, until December 31st, in order to increase its effectiveness for you and for the rest of the population.

Note: Those who get the shot early, until December 31st receive a benefit of 20 ILS in copay for doctor visits within the HMO. Those who get the shot late, after December 31st, will not receive this benefit. Those who do not get the shot will also not receive this benefit.
